Who is Alix Aharon?

Alix Aharon is the stage name of Alexandra "Alix" Hecht, a Scottish anti-transgender activist. She is a co-founder of anti-transgender front group Partners for Ethical Care.

Alix took data from a map of trans-supportive healthcare providers to create an anti-trans project called The Gender Offender Mapper (later called The Gender Mapping Project). She is an advisor for Women's Liberation Front (WoLF).

Alix was born in Glasgow, Scotland. She graduated from Craigholme School for Girls in 2003 and earned a bachelor's degree from University of Aberdeen in 2007. Alix has worked in sales for SuperDerivatives, Checkmarx, WalkMe, AppSee, dLocal, Wishbox, Duve, and Coro.

Alix had an "aggressive eating disorder" for ten years. She emigrated to Israel and spends time in California and Tel Aviv.

Who is Jon Uhler?

Jon K. Uhler, MS, LPC, has been a professional therapist for over 25 years, working in a wide variety of clinical settings, including outpatient, inpatient, residential, and hospital settings. He spent over 10 years working with adjudicated troubled teens, prior to his 11+ years working with incarcerated men within both medium and maximum prison settings, during which time he evaluated and treated approximately 4000 Low and High-Risk sex offenders, including sexually violent predators. He is clinically trained and certified by the PA Dept. of Corrections in the management of both sex offender treatment and dual diagnosis programming. Additionally, he has been certified in the PCL-R, the Static-99R, the PAI, and the TJTA.
